TTA offers a Public Safety Leadership Academy is a five-day (40-hour) course, covering a wide range of leadership topics such as effective communication, leadership analytics, and employee engagement. Other eligible TAA programs include the Certificate of Supervisory Leadership (40-hours), Certificate of Strategic Leadership (40-hours), and the Public Safety Command College (80-hours). Each includes a rigorous classroom curriculum, case study analysis, and comprehensive experiential learning components – hands-on learning which aligns with the teaching philosophy at Albertus Magnus College.

The added-value of real life experience is something that differentiates Albertus Magnus College from other institutions of higher learning. All of our full-time faculty retired after working 20-years in law enforcement.
